Our School



The High School Leckhampton is an 11-16 comprehensive school which opened its doors in September 2021. The school was commissioned by Gloucestershire County Council to cater for an expansion in pupil numbers at secondary level in the south Cheltenham area. The school is being sponsored and developed by The Balcarras Trust who have been centrally involved in all aspects of the new school's development since 2018. The school opened to Year 7 pupils in September 2021 and was temporarily located at Balcarras School. In September 2022, we moved to our permanent home on Farm Lane, where the school welcomed a new cohort of Year 7 pupils. Eventually we will accommodate 900 pupils. The Farm Lane site is located on the southern edge of Cheltenham, just over 2 miles from Balcarras School. The school occupies an idyllic setting, a stone's throw from the Cotswolds Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and nestled below Devil's Chimney. It is a superb place for a school site.

Our Curriculum

CHAMPIONING INTELLECTUAL GROWTH AND ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

We believe that our curriculum is transformational, equipping our students, regardless of their starting point, with a wide range of knowledge and skills, enabling them to fulfil their potential and realise their ambitions. We are unapologetic in our academic ambitions and our teachers will work tirelessly to secure the best **educational outcomes** for all our pupils.

The curriculum aims to:

- be broad, balanced and relevant, developing all the essential knowledge, understanding and skills, regardless of gender, ability, ethnicity or social background
- ensure equal access to learning for all pupils, with high expectations for every pupil and appropriate levels of challenge and support
- · encourage students to enjoy their learning and get a sense of success through their achievements
- foster scientific, technical, cultural and sporting achievement
- · support pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development
- support pupils' physical development and responsibility for their own health, and enable them to be active
- generate a wealth of cross-curricular activities including events, clubs, performances and trips which will be open to all
- equip pupils with the knowledge and cultural capital they need to contribute positively to their community
- promote British values, including the rule of law, democracy and individual liberty. We will instil in students the importance of tolerance, fair play and a generosity of spirit
- prepare students for the next stage in their lives by encouraging resilience, self-reliance and an understanding of their responsibility to take ownership of their own learning









Curriculum Design:

Careful thought has been given by our school leaders to curriculum design, ensuring that our implementation closely reflects our values and local needs (our curriculum intent). As subject specialists, Curriculum Leaders are empowered to develop their own department's curriculum. There is a strong emphasis on progression within each subject, with lessons carefully sequenced in order to maximise learning and supported by timely and appropriate assessments.

Key Stage 3

We ensure a smooth transition from KS2, by collaborating closely with our partner primaries and with early experiences organised for new pupils and their parents. All pupils will study the same subjects, including English, Maths, Science, History, Geography, Computing, Art, D&T, PE, Drama, French, Music, RE and PSHE (which includes careers guidance). The model will develop lifetime skills and inspire our students to gain mastery of the core curriculum.

Key Stage 4

All students in Years 10 and 11 will study English Language, English Literature, Maths, Science, Physical Education (Core) and PSHE (including RE and Careers Guidance). Other subjects will be optional, but we expect the vast majority to choose a combination that will meet the criteria of the English Baccalaureate. The assumption is that all students will study GCSE courses. The final list of subjects offered will be confirmed when pupils are in Year 9, however these are likely to include: Business, History, Geography, Computer Science, Art, D&T Product Design, D&T Textiles, D&T Food & Nutrition, Drama, French, Spanish, Music, RE, PE, and Single Science.







Pastoral Care

THE HOUSE SYSTEM

Our House system is at the heart of our pastoral care provision, allowing each child to fully immerse themselves in the school values. As well as providing a happy, safe, and supportive community, the House system allows all pupils to engage with the spirit of competition throughout their time in school but to also seek support from staff when needed.

Each child who joins the school is placed in one of our four Houses:









All pupils will go through a journey during their time at The High School Leckhampton, much like the rivers and tributaries we have named our Houses after, and although each House has its own "personality" they are all committed to providing a supportive community where opportunities are offered, and achievements celebrated.

There is a full calendar of House competitions including Music, Sport, and Languages.

Enrichment, Engagement & Enjoyment

An important part of your child's education at The High School Leckhampton is our enrichment curriculum. The school offers a wide range of clubs, before and after school, as well as at lunchtimes, and all pupils are expected to participate. The school production is a highlight of the school calendar, and a very high percentage of our pupils have private music tuition during the school day. We also offer Public Speaking (LAMDA) tuition.



Future Leaders



Our pupils are in the unique and privileged position of being able to lead and shape the school community as we grow. Consequently, your child will have significant and frequent opportunities to develop their leadership and teamwork skills. For example, they may stand for election to represent their tutor group on our House Council, Learning Council or as a Sports Leader. They could volunteer to be a member of our Eco-Committee which works to raise awareness about protecting the environment and drive sustainable initiatives involving our whole school community as part of the Eco-Schools programme. They may also choose to join the Rights Respecting School steering group.

Sporting Excellence

The benefits of developing a healthy, active lifestyle cannot be underestimated and your child can expect to be fully involved in a fantastic sporting calendar. From highly competitive team sport to recreational clubs, we promote and value physical activity for all our pupils.

School Uniform
