## Eco-Committee

The HSL Eco-Committee have been busy! Before the half term break, some members of the committee were interviewed as part of a research project looking at leadership responses to Climate Change Education in secondary schools. A researcher from the University of Bristol, asked the students what was happening as HSL in relation to climate change education, and what they would like to see happen at HSL in the future. A follow-up interview will take place a year from now to ask what the committee have achieved after a year in our brand-new school building.



Along with nearly 1500 other schools, The High School Leckhampton have now joined the Let's Go Zero campaign (<https://letszero.org>) and pledged to become zero carbon by 2030. This will be a huge challenge for the HSL community; however, it presents a great opportunity for the school to play its part in the fight against climate change. As well as planning to deliver an assembly to the rest of the year group next month, the HSL Eco-Committee have also produced a leaf display of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals which can now be found on the Eco Noticeboard (a picture of this is below).

More recently, some committee members attended the Balcarras Green Group Meeting with Mr Pearce and Miss Kennedy afterschool on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> June. Amelie H, Katie W, Henry T and his dad discussed ideas and actions that could be taken next academic year to reduce waste and single-use plastics, recycle a greater variety of items, encourage our community to make more eco-friendly lifestyle choices, and maintain the link between the HSL Eco-Committee and the Balcarras Eco Club. The first Green Group Meeting in our new building will take place on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> November 2022 and is open to the staff, students, and parents of HSL. I took part in the Bristol Karting Club Sports Championship race and came 2<sup>nd</sup> out of 22 people from ages 12 - 69


