Community Pantry - Springbank Community Group

We are very grateful to have received so many donations from you for the Community Pantry, organised and run by the Springbank Community Group, to support those in our town who may need additional support over the Christmas period.

The Pantry gives local people in need the opportunity to top up their weekly food shopping for a small contribution of just **£3.50**. With each visit, members will often leave with approximately **£15** worth of shopping, which, for many, is crucial to feed their families. The Community Pantry runs entirely on donations from local residents and organisations.

As a Unicef Rights Respecting school we focus on a different children's right each month; for December it is number 27 – the right to food, clothing and safe housing. We feel that by supporting this organisation we can help young people locally access this key right.

Some of our students have been kind enough to help pack up the donations that will be passed on to the Community Pantry.
