Time Capsule

Anti-Bullying Week

HSL students were involved in Anti-Bullying Week (15th-19th November). As part of raising awareness about spreading kindness, the children were invited to wear odd socks for the day to celebrate and embrace difference within the school's community. The children had a lovely day and had thoughtful discussions with their tutor groups about why spreading kindness is key to challenging bullying.



Miss O'Riordan delivered an 'Anti Bullying' assembly which utilised the Anti Bullying Alliance's resources and will be popping into tutor groups this week to see who is embracing this week's challenge of spreading 'One Kind Word'. The powerpoint slides from this assembly are on our website.

We will continue to educate the children of The High School Leckhampton about why bullying is wrong through our assemblies, PSHE sessions and throughout the curriculum. The children's two-hour PSHE session this week is based on what bullying is, why it is wrong and how can we spread kindness to all. In each tutor room, posters have been put up to show the children that staff are very much willing to listen and help, should there be a problem.

Scopay update

We appreicate your patience as the SCOPAY system is brought inline with the Balcarras system. This has now been resolved and you should be able to top-up canteen cards using the canteen tab on Scopay. This also includes being able to see your childs balance and what they are buying.



COVID 19 and Remote Access to work REMINDER

We are pleased to see that positive test for COVID amongst our pupils have dropped significantly since the October Half Term break. However, please remember that pupils should still be doing Lateral Flow tests twice a week. These are available from school. If a lateral flow test is positive, it is important to arrange a PCR test and keep your child off school. If the PCR test is positive, they must remain off school for 10 days. If the PCR test is negative, they can come back into school if they feel well enough. Please keep the school informed at every stage of the process.

Please remind your child that it is recommended they wear a face mask on school transport.

If your child is absent due to COVID <u>and</u> is well enough to complete work, this can be accessed on the VLE.

Please do let the school know if your child is likely to find it difficult to access their work remotely and we will work with you to find a solution.
