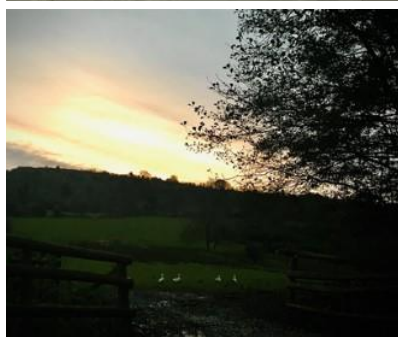


### Twin Town photo competition

Some of our pupils have entered and below are a few of the beautiful photographs they have taken. Good luck to each of them!





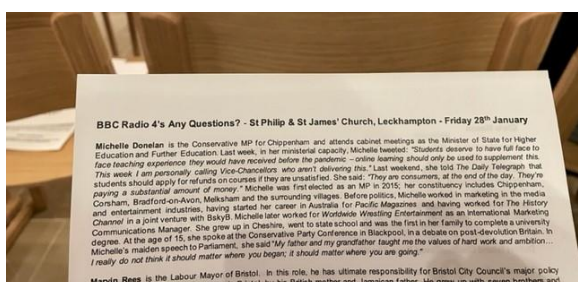
### Thick jumper day

## Radio BBC4 Any Questions?

We would like to say a huge thank you to Reverend Nick Davies of St. Phillip and St. James' Church, who invited us to select 3 pupils to attend a recording of BBC Radio 4's Any Questions?, on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> January at the Church.

The show goes out to an audience of 1.6 million listeners over Friday night and Saturday morning and is hosted by Chris Mason. Maisie, Seb and Harry were the lucky pupils whose names were pulled from the hat and they prepared some brilliant questions for the panel which consisted of Marvin Rees (elected Mayor of Bristol), the Rt Hon Michelle Donelan MP (Minister for Higher and Further Education), Dale Vince (owner of Ecotricity and Chairman of Forest Green Rovers), and Alice Thomson (author and journalist for The Times).



It was fascinating to see how the programme was made, with the producers selecting only 6 questions from the hundreds they received from the audience.
