There are numerous policies required and perhaps unsurprisingly, I have started with key ones relating to Safeguarding, Child Protection, Recruitment and the Curriculum. working in close partnership with pupils and parents to encourage excellence, expand the children's horizons and put additional support in place if necessary. I'm really looking forward to meeting our first cohort.
