#### Our new website

You will still be able to access the new site from our existing domain, as we will only be moving over to the permanent domain name in the summer term. ## Our temporary home at Balcarras



Planning permission for our temporary home at Balcarras was passed by Cheltenham Borough Council at the end of December. The Balcarras Trust have since met with TG Escapes, the contractors, and building work is due to commence on Monday 25th January. We will publish photos in the news section of our website shortly. The Trust is also currently working with the Gloucestershire County Council to confirm the two bus routes that will bring our pupils to the site at Balcarras in September. Details of these routes and information about how parents can apply will be published at the beginning of March, around the time of national offer day. 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## Building a learning school – Teacher recruitment and curriculum planning

One of the most exciting parts of creating a new school is bringing together the teachers and support staff who will bring the school to life. I am currently fully engaged in the intricacies of curriculum planning and staffing for our school. In the next 2 weeks I will have recruited a key senior position in the school, Pastoral Lead Teacher. This person will play a crucial role in shaping the House system and developing the pastoral care of our pupils. I am working with The Trust to secure the very best person for this role and we have taken the approach of recruiting from Balcarras School, as we are seeking an experienced colleague who will share Balcarras' ethos, values and commitment with us, to develop the whole child. Once we have made this appointment, we will be advertising nationally for subject teacher positions and continue staffing our school with first-class teachers who share our vision. It is a very exciting time indeed!

### **Remote learning**


At the time of writing, it is almost certain that you are engaged in remote learning with your child. I know from personal experience how challenging this can be, balancing the demands of working from home with the technical demands of 'live' lessons. It is important that children in Year 6 continue to apply themselves to their studies as best they can. Time spent learning at home, however challenging, will allow them to develop a great many skills that will help them when they arrive at The High School Leckhampton, not least resilience and independence. Please reassure your children that we will be working closely with their Primary Schools, to understand their experience and progress over the next two terms and we will ensure that our transition plans are supportive, clear and tailored to their needs. I have already arranged several introductory meetings with local Primary school Headteachers and I am looking forward to building strong, relationships with them over the coming months.
