When we arrived, we headed straight to the town hall to see an event about "The Science of TikTok" where a man showed us the science behind Tik Tok's experiments. He proved to us that some of them were fake, like the magic candle or the coke and mentos. However, some of them were also real, like the orange and the balloon. One of our favourite experiments was the coke and the milk, where someone in America put ice, milk, and coke in a cup and enjoyed it, yet someone in England tried it and was nearly sick. Eco-Committee Update

On Monday 5th June, six members of the Eco-Committee, along with Miss Kennedy and Mrs Wood, were interviewed by Lauren Hennessy from the Climate Change Education Network based at the University of Bristol. Last year, HSL signed up to take part in a research project looking at leadership responses to Climate Change Education in secondary schools and our students have really enjoyed being part of it. The Secondary Leadership in Climate Education (SLiCE) project is scheduled to end on 1st September 2023 and we will share the report with our school community once it is published.

Thank you to Lauren (7CH), Jacob (7IS), Katie (8CH), Lily (8IS), Constance (8WI) and Henry (8WI) for taking part in the interviews.

Lauren has written about her experience below:

"As a member of the Eco-Committee who was interviewed, we were asked some school- and Eco-related questions by a Bristol University researcher called Lauren. I think that it was important that we were interviewed because it means that other people can see what we are doing for the planet, and maybe encourage others to do the same."

The Eco-Committee have also been busy working to construct a couple of insect hotels in our nature area at HSL, as part of the Biodiversity Topic in our Eco-Schools Action Plan.







HSL secures a win in the Michelmores Property Awards



Our pupils competed earlier in the month at the Girls and Boys Minors Athletics Competition at the Prince of Wales stadium. All the secondary schools in Cheltenham attended this event and HSL performed incredibly well across both the track and field.

The Year 7 and 8 Rounders teams have had a successful season, and attendance at clubs has been incredibly high with boys and girls playing in each year group. In the recent District Rounders tournaments both the Year 7 and Year 8 teams finished 5th out of 10 schools, narrowly missing out on the top 3 positions by 1 rounder and a ½ rounder respectively. In school matches and at the tournaments all players have demonstrated some fantastic tactical awareness in their fielding and are continuing to improve with the bat in every game.






Art and DT Summer Exhibition



Art and Photography Club

Photography club has been going strong since September and during that time many members of both Year 7 and 8 have joined in. The club introduces students to the world of digital image making and encourages them to closely observe the world around them. Students have built up their confidence by taking on several challenges covering a range of subjects and themes with a focus on the elements and principles of design.

Favourite tasks have been the creation of an entire alphabet by photographing and cropping shapes to show individual letters, and the pareidolia challenge which encouraged students to see and record faces in everyday objects and locations.

The club meets every two weeks and students share their outcomes with everyone at the start of each session and give constructive feedback and discuss their intentions. It's a valuable and hugely positive experience giving students fresh insight and different interpretations of their visual outcomes.

Please view all the work created so far this year in the 'Student' area of the VLE, in the Photography Club section. Photography club will run in September and anyone interested in joining is more than welcome.







The Art and DT department need your help and would welcome the donation of any of the following items:

Please purchase your child's place on the trip by Thursday 6th July 2023 on Scopay, which will also act as your consent for your child to attend the trip.


