Dear Parents/Carers of Year 8 pupils,

As we approach the end of a fantastic school year, we thought it would be helpful to write with confirmation of arrangements for the final few days and the start of term, with an outline of what your child will encounter as they move into Year 9. If we think back to this time last year, when we had not even taken occupation of the school and your child was finishing Year 7, it seems like a lifetime ago. However, I'm sure that the holidays will fly past and September will arrive in an instant, so do keep this letter safe and refer to it as the start of term approaches as it contains a lot of important information that will help your child make a smooth start to Year 9.

# **End of Term arrangements**

# PTFA BBQ: Friday 14<sup>th</sup> July 7-9pm

We are hoping that parents will attend this end of year celebration, come rain or shine, between 7-9pm. There will be a BBQ, bar, some musical entertainment and our pupils are planning to run some stalls, so do bring siblings and some cash! I'm sure the PTFA would be grateful for any help, so please let them know if you can support the event in any way. We will also be selling our preloved uniform and you will be able to peruse the table of lost items - some of which look very expensive!

# Last day: Friday 21st July 12:20

Pupils must take all belongings home before the end of school, including anything in lockers (and their padlocks), as the lockers will be cleaned and reallocated in September. Any padlocks left on after the end of term will be cut off and belongings will either be recycled, included in our pre-loved uniform sale, or donated to charity.

# **Start of Autumn Term**

# Tuesday 5th September – ALL PUPILS

Pupils return to school on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> September. This is *week one* of the school timetable. As always on the first day back the pupils will be issued with their timetable and a new planner. Please ensure that Scopay accounts are topped up and they arrive with the equipment that they need for their lessons. If you would like to purchase an Art or Maths kit please do so on Scopay by **17**<sup>th</sup> July. If you are purchasing a new schoolbag, we strongly recommend you purchase a rucksack as these are large enough to carry exercise books, and pupils can conveniently carry RSU them.

# **INSET AFTERNOON: Friday 8th September**

Please note that on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> September, the school will end for pupils at **12:20pm**. This is so that staff can participate in compulsory safeguarding INSET. We appreciate that this may be inconvenient for working parents who may not want their child to be at home unsupervised. If this is the case, please let us know and your child will be allowed to work independently in the library until 15:35pm. However, they will need to bring a packed lunch on this day if you would like them to stay, as we will not be offering cooked meals.



## Uniform

You may be aware that one of our uniform suppliers, Universal Uniform (the School Uniform Shop) has recently sold its business to Monkhouse. We have met with the team at Monkhouse to ensure they are well stocked with our uniform. They are offering an exclusive late-night opening for parents of High School students on **Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> August**. We are pleased to let you know that they have reduced the cost of our school trousers by 30%, which we hope will help ease the cost of purchasing replacements.

We are currently sourcing a second supplier and will give you more information in the Autumn Term.

Finally, I would like to remind parents that we have a supply of pre-loved uniform available, either free or for a small donation. The items we have in stock will be on display at our end of year BBQ on Friday, 14<sup>th</sup> July. **We welcome any donations, so please send them into school with your child to hand into reception.**

#### Lockers

In September, your child will be asked if they would like to use a school locker. If so, they will be **issued with a <u>school</u> padlock** and allocated a specific numbered locker. They do not need to bring their old padlocks in. There will be no charge for a locker, however, if they lose the school padlock parents will be expected to cover the cost of replacement. As we are being joined by an additional 150 pupils this September, we would welcome hearing from pupils who are happy to share a locker. Tutors will be allocating lockers during the first week of term and pupils can let them know if they are happy to share.

### **The Year 9 Curriculum**

In Year 9, your child will study the same subjects as they have done previously in year Eight. However, in some subjects they will find that we mix up pupils from 2 tutor groups. This is to ensure that pupils have the opportunity to make new friends and therefore broaden their horizons. Please note that these classes will not be set by ability. However, we will continue to group by ability in maths.

During the course of Year 9, we will be talking to your child about their academic interests and strengths in preparation for them choosing their GCSE options in February time. As option time approaches, we will also be offering an information evening for parents and pupils so that you can talk to their teachers about GCSE courses. We will support both you and your child in making informed choices by holding a subject parents' evening and providing feedback in an interim report. This is an exciting time for your child and we will ensure that both you and they have all the information they need to make the right choice for them going forward.

#### **Reporting and assessments**

In Year 9, you will receive three interim reports, including a full terminal report and a GCSE options evening and a subject parents' evening. In order to prepare pupils for key stage



four, there will be an assessment fortnight at the end of Year 9 that we will support pupils to prepare for their GCSEs. Further information regarding these assessments will be given to you and the pupils nearer the time.

### Homework and study

As your child moves into Year 9, you will notice that the curriculum becomes more challenging, as their skills and knowledge mature. Consequently, we will expect them to work for longer periods independently and as such homework will typically take them between 30 and 45 minutes per subject. To support families with this, your child is welcome to stay after school in our new 'Study' sessions. In study, pupils can work independently, with access to a computer and the support of a Teaching Assistant or member of teaching staff. Study is entirely optional, and we hope provides a quiet purposeful atmosphere where pupils can complete necessary homework and prepare for assessments. There is no need for you to tell us if your child is attending study. They are welcome to drop in on an ad hoc basis. Parents should make arrangements to collect their child at the end or allow them to walk home independently.

### New Teachers and Teaching Assistants

Many pupils have been involved in the recruitment of these colleagues, so you may well have already heard about them!

### **Extracurricular clubs**

We are already delighted with the quality and breadth of extracurricular opportunities available at The High School Leckhampton. With the addition of more teachers, we have been able to add even greater breath to our offer from September. Your child will be given the opportunity to participate in their usual clubs, with the addition of philosophy club, macrame club, theatre critics club and physical theatre club. We would really appreciate your support in ensuring that they attend at least one club each week. A full list will be published on our website at the start of term so that you can look at it together ready for a positive start in September.
