


# Newsletter

It's very impressive that you have formed such a large Eco-Committee. It shows that young people in your school are aware of environmental issues and committed to being active and creating positive change. This knowledge and attitude has provided your school with excellent foundations for the many successes that you've achieved this year.

It's also wonderful to hear that the student, in the quote provided, has maintained their involvement in the Eco-Committee since their primary school days, and has continued to do so throughout their secondary school experience. Their dedication to the cause is truly inspiring and surely a great addition to the team.

It's brilliant to read that the Environmental Review helped your pupils appreciate everything that your school is already doing to benefit our environment and identify areas to work on in the future. ### SCHOOL GAMES SILVER MARK AWARD FOR THE HIGH SCHOOL LECKHAMPTON



We are delighted to announce that we, The High School Leckhampton, have achieved the School Games Silver Mark Award for the 2022/23 academic year.

The School Games Mark is a Government-led award scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community, and we are delighted to have been recognised for our success.

All of our pupils have contributed to the House Sports Programme, competing in the intra-school event of house cross country, alongside many other sports intra-school house sports events throughout the year.

We have competed in the Cheltenham District netball, hockey, football, rounders, athletics, swimming and cross country events with a total of 160 young people competing in local inter-school competitions this year. We are extremely proud of our pupils for their dedication to all aspects of school sport, including those young volunteers, leaders and officials who made our competitions possible.

As part of our application, we were asked to fulfil criteria in the areas of participation, competition, workforce and clubs, and we are pleased that the hard work of everyone at our school has been rewarded this year.

We look forward to building on the fantastic sporting programme next year and ensuring all of our pupils continue to take part in physical activity.




















### The Richard Slessor Memorial Prize

In June, pupils were given the opportunity to enter a competition organised by the local branch of the Historical Association. The Richard Slessor Memorial Prize is awarded each year to a young person between the ages of 11 and 18, for writing an essay about an aspect of local history.

This year was the first opportunity of its kind offered to HSL pupils, and Mrs Cox is delighted that three pupils have written essays after selecting their own topic and carrying out research. - Constance Grant 8WI Pittville Park and class attitudes in 20th century Cheltenham








In the penultimate week of the summer term, we were delighted to host our first enrichment week at Farm Lane. The week was designed to be varied, enjoyable and supplementary to our curriculum. The first two days were spent learning about different areas of the world, with a focus on Asia and Oceania. Students participated in a range of activities for each day, to help them understand small elements of each continent from the perspective of different subjects.

In Art, students were able to investigate origami and successfully made paper cranes. In Geography, students planned a grand tour of Asia, choosing a specific site to recommend to a tourist and then exploring the practicalities of arranging travel. In History, students investigated how Australia was used as a penal colony, whilst in Maths, students were guided in alternative methods of calculation used in China.

The third day of the week was an opportunity to have a little fun and we were delighted to take 180 of our students to the Lido in Cheltenham, where the weather was (mostly) perfect for some summer swimming! Other students went to the Cinema, or completed Collagraph Printing in an Art session and some fantastic examples are shown below.

Our fourth day of the week was a day of Sport, where students rotated through a number of activities that promoted health and fitness. Finally our Friday was an opportunity for raising money for charity through a sponsored event. The weather was not kind to us, so our planned walk hard to be cancelled, but students were able to participate in other fundraising activities.








This is a very intense physical and mental challenge lasting over six hours!

Since April 2022 many schools in Gloucestershire have welcomed children from Ukraine who have fled war with their families. The Homes for Ukraine scheme has allowed Gloucestershire households to share their homes while Ukrainians get settled in Gloucestershire.

The Homes for Ukraine team at the county council are urgently seeking follow-on placements for guests who have already been in the UK for 6 months to 1 year, and have not yet fully regained their independence.

Relocating to a new host can mean children need to change schools, leaving their friendships and disrupting their education. We can support Ukrainian children in our school community by helping them stay in the same area and attend the same school.

Please note that Gloucestershire County Council have locally increased all host payments to £600 per month, so lower figures published in the national guidance can be disregarded.

The Homes for Ukraine team would then let you know about guests who match your household.

Meet the guests and get to know them before deciding whether to go shead with horting.

Hosting agreements are very flexible, and the Homes for Ukraine team are available to assist and advise you every step of the way.

All hosts receive payments of 5000 per month to thank you for your help and to cover any additional household expenses. These payments are tas free, and hosting will not impact your council tax.
