Physical Education

We've had another action-packed term in PE at HSL, with the pupils continuing to work hard in their activities of gymnastics and hockey. Attendance at extra-curricular clubs also continues to be incredibly high, even on the colder, darker mornings! The House gym and dance competition was incredibly popular with pupils choreographing and rehearsing in their spare time – the standard was very high across the school and a full round up will be available in our January Newsletter!

During the term, Year 9 boys played their first Rugby match at HSL against Bournside School. It was a hugely positive game against a very physical Bournside team and our pupils learnt a lot throughout the match and played some great passing rugby. A huge thank you to the Staff at Bournside PE for their support and for very kindly donating some Rugby Post Protectors.

The Year 9 girls netball team played in the County Netball Tournament against Kings, Ribston, Winchcombe, Chosen Hill and Tewkesbury. The team were very efficient in their play, using the space on court effectively and moving the ball around at speed to allow a lot of shooting opportunities that were converted well throughout the whole day.

The Year 8 and 9 netball teams played Pittville Year 9's recently, and again some fluent netball was played by all on court, where all our players demonstrated a very good skill level and composure with their decision making against strong opposition. Some of the Year 9 Sports Leaders umpired the netball match too!





The Year 7 & 8 girls football teams were also in action against Cleeve school on the same night. All the matches were closely contested with an abundance of goals scored by both schools. A well participated event, with nearly half of the girls in the whole year group taking part!

Physical Education

Our Year 7 boys have been battling it out in football training this term and played in the Year 7 A Football Tournament hosted at Tewkesbury School. This was a great opportunity to play against the other schools in the county and has given us plenty to focus on for the football season next term.

The Year 8 A&B's have been challenging the Year 9 A&B's Boys football teams too this term, building up their 11-aside experience before the football leagues kick off in January. We are extremely impressed with their commitment, with both year groups containing around 60 boys each. We have had nearly 30 taking part in these friendly matches representing their year group.

The girl's hockey teams have continued to make fantastic progress this term. The Year 8 team have had several fixtures and have continued to display some excellent skills and tactical understanding against other local schools.



Our U12's Girls Hockey team surpassed all expectations on Friday at the Gloucestershire County Hockey tournament. An outstanding 3rd place finish out of 9 teams involved.

The HSL squad all played a part in the success, with a flurry of goals from Hattie Street, Sofia Topolansky, Scarlett Robertson, Amber Wintle and Delilah Hopper - beating the likes of CLC, Bournside and KLB. The team had a fantastic day and sacrificed their free inset day, to represent the school, which we are very thankful for. Well done to all involved and we look forward to the next season already!

Physical Education

The HSL cross country runners were out in full force this month, following the previously cancelled District Championships in October.



The standard of running across the district was very impressive, with over 150 runners in each race but our HSL athletes did not disappoint. We finished 5th out of 12 schools in the Year 8&9 girls and the Year 8&9 boys. We finished 6th in the Year 7 boys, and we took a very impressive 1st place for the Year 7 girls. The pupils listed below were all selected to represent Cheltenham at the County Championships at the beginning of December, running on a very cold and wet morning, on an incredibly muddy course in Newent. All athletes performed brilliantly in their races and we were very proud to hear of their efforts in such tough conditions.

Here is a brief synopsis:


'Old Marley's magic was beginning to stir..."


