- Let parents know about any concerns or problems that relate to attendance, punctuality or equipment and/or affect their child's work or behaviour
- Keep parents informed about school activities through our newsletter and other appropriate letters and notices about special events
- Promote Unicef's Convention on the Rights of the Child at school

PUPIL As a pupil I shall do my best to:

- Attend punctually each day in correct uniform
